RECEIVING GIFTS

Throughout the month of December Grace Christian School received many gifts and we are thankful. Families gave gifts of chocolate, expo markers, and gift cards to our staff. We received several trailer loads of school desks and chairs from a couple of supporting businesses. God provided an opportunity to purchase school equipment at a huge discount. (The next page highlights some of those.) We have four 27 year old furnaces on the roof that run about \$10,000 each to replace. A business man gave us a gift of \$10,000 earmarked for furnaces for when that day comes. As I write this note, furnace guys came into my office to say that our most troubled unit is down 2 months because the parts are not available. The cashier's check is not 30 days old and is still on my desk. It seems that God still uses His people to provide. There are many others who gave year end gifts and because of those, we made it through 2023 without any payroll drama. We are in the middle of January and we will receive the first significant gift from our thrift store, Reclaimed by Grace, to help us make this week's payroll. That store has been a blessing to our school in so many ways, and yes, they are still in need of helpers/volunteers.

There are a lot of moving parts in a system like this. There are many days I am overwhelmed with what needs to be done at GCS, and the difficulty the problems present. I often walk away from the school at the end of the day and say out loud that Grace Christian School is a miracle. There is no other way to explain its existence for 50 years. In the course of time, we have done some dumb things, and yet God chose to sustain us. Even during the 'smart times' we find ourselves falling before the Throne of Grace. January and February are often lean times for Grace and this year seems to be no different. We thank you and many others for the gifts of support you give us.


