THE BOY WHO CRIED WOLF

We are set to celebrate our 50th year April 27th. We will hear testimony and memories from decades past and close with a vision for the future of GCS. There have been many blessings, successes, and miracles realized in the history of our loved school. There has also been stress, sleepless nights, and devoted prayer meetings about how our school will stay open. This Tuesday, April 16th at 7:00 PM, is the GCEA Annual Meeting. If you are not familiar with our school, this is the one meeting a year where the members of our Association make decisions (Budget & Board Members) for the coming year. It is where the School Board gives a report of what has happened in the 23-24 school year and sets the agenda for the 24-25 school year.

The Annual Meeting is an opportunity to share the year's triumphs and describe the hopes and plans for the coming year. There are so many good things we want to give God glory for. What often keeps the Annual Meeting from being a celebration is the budget. We have 50 years of witness and testimony that this is not a new thing. So, when I say, "We have a money problem," I hear from those familiar with GCS, "Well, that's nothing new." This is where 'The Boy Who Cried Wolf' reference kicks in. There is a sense that Grace always needs money and that 'somehow, someway God will provide. It just won't be through me. I did my time.'

This year we have more clarity of the needs of the school than we have had in many years. We have financial needs and we have volunteer needs. For 50 years, our school marvels that we made it through the year, financially. We are usually in bad financial shape to start the next year. In the recent past as a budget is set, there is concern and wondering how this is going to work out. That tension is realized during payroll weeks when the business office says, "We're \$12,000 short on making payroll this week. What do you want us to do?" I cannot say "Go ahead and print some money." In the past, I think we've lied to ourselves by saying we have a cashflow problem. A cashflow problem indicates there is enough cash coming eventually, just not when you need it. Our problem is worse than that. We are cash deficient; it is not eventually coming. Why is that? We do not have a balanced budget. The 24-25 budget needs an additional \$150,000 of income to be a balanced budget, and this will be the central discussion at the Annual Meeting.

This year's school experience for both families and staff is as good as it has been in many years. There is a business principle that you do not cut your way into prosperity. We will discuss at the Annual Meeting different parts of the budget you could cut to balance the budget, but it would be like a wrestler trying to make weight by cutting off different parts of his body. He may have lost his left arm and will no longer be an effective wrestler, but he made weight. There are consequences to cuts. We would rather see growth and invite you to help us close the gap.

So, all hands-on deck: We need everyone to help us reach people who want to help kids get a Christian education. We will be replacing our financial aid with student/family sponsorship. Why? Because we do not have

financial aid money. We also need more families to buy in and participate with the activities (building projects, cleaning, athletics, mowing) at the school. If you see a need, be the answer to the need. This school is your school. The school itself is not a self-willed entity. When we give up, the school gives up. The 24-25 school year is going to happen by God's grace if we have the desire to make it happen with God's help. The vision for the future of Grace Christian School is to



daily walk with God as we work out our mission statement of making disciples of Jesus Christ to impact their world with the tools they received in our classrooms. There are a thousand things that support our mission. We are starting with a balanced budget, school accreditation, and building/safety upgrades.

Looking forward to Tuesday, it is the first step where we get this figured out.


RE-ENROLLMENT IS ONLINE!


ELEMENTARY MUSICAL

Do you want a fun and wholesome summer activity for your child?


