THE CENTER OF ATTENTION

What a privilege and learning experience it has been these 7 weeks teaching gym classes! The extra work has been difficult to assimilate into an overly full life, yet it is through these trials that God often teaches us the most. I previously had taught middle school for 5 years nearly 10 years ago and came to the conclusion that adults were just covert middle school kids. In many respects, adults have just learned to hide their immaturity in the different settings that demand it. When there is no standard of conduct, our natural behavior is expressed. This is most openly seen at football tailgates, late-night bars, and behind the doors of our homes.

The elementary world has been eye-opening. I am astounded over the silly things that kids pick a fight over. Then they come to the teacher to settle the dispute. It causes me to reflect in my own life about the things that I get hung up on and how silly they may seem to our God. In my short time in leadership at Grace Christian School, my greatest conflicts have been with other Christians over what would seem to be (actually are) trivial with respect to the mission at hand.

Christianity has a call for unity. Unity comes not by arguing your point unto victory, but rather sacrificing your own personal interest for the interest of others and therefore the benefit of the whole body.

Philippians 2:3-4 "Do nothing from selfishness or empty conceit, but with humility of mind regard one another as more important than yourselves; do not merely look out for your own personal interests, but also for the interests of others."

Christianity is not a monolithic belief system that details out every belief and behavior. Rather it is a principled belief system that you apply to various situations in life. Romans 14 details how we are to disagree with one another according to our convictions, knowing it is before God who we stand in judgement, and not one another. The conclusions start in verse 13 that we ought to be walking according to love (John 13:35) and that we pursue the things that make for peace (vs 19). Yes, that is peace with those we disagree with. That peace often comes from personal sacrifice, as detailed in Philippians 2. When we are wronged or sacrifice our interest for the interest of others, we place our faith in the God who knows and promises to work out everything for the good of those who love Him (Romans 8:28).

So, there is a "Center of Attention" problem. One of the many things we are teaching our students at Grace is that you are not the only person in the room. There are others who have needs. This runs contrary to human nature. After 3 years of walking with Jesus, the disciples were still arguing over who was the greatest among them. This is a battle we are engaged in on an hourly basis for the development of the character of our students. Please pray for our teachers because this is exhausting, but it is essential if we are going to produce graduates that "impact the world for Jesus Christ".

- In October, we were able to hire a PE teacher with Watervliet through the Shared Time* program.
- \$4,000 (half of the amount needed) was donated toward replacement gym doors. The \$4,000 given was intended to inspire a matching gift. Would you consider helping us get this significant need met?
- Title money was obtained to enable our teachers to benefit from professional development training last week at the Michigan Association of Christian Schools (MACS) Conference.
- An anonymous donor covered the fee for GCS student athletes to participate in Twin City Sharks football.
- In August, we were able to contract two teachers with Watervliet through the Shared Time* program.
- Heart of Cook Grant \$5,000 for the purchase of a new commercial refrigerator.
- Anonymous donor gave \$2,000 toward student sponsorship.
- Mr. Clean's Cleaning and Restoration cleaned our carpets to prepare for the school year.
- Thank you to those who have brought in school supplies, paper, pencils, facial tissue and cleaning supplies for classrooms.
- School furniture was donated by a St. Joseph business man.
- The thrift store hit their first anniversary on August 12th and in this first year contributed about \$53,000 to the school scholarship fund.
- We received a \$15,000 gift to put toward student scholarships last year. This year we have many other sponsors who have picked families to support. Sponsorship for the 2024-25 school year is complete.
- Roy's Computer Repair and the Nuismer family for their generosity in helping to update our network infrastructure.
- Many hands came together to help get the building and grounds ready for students.

GCS ATHLETICS PROGRAM

At Grace Christian School, athletics truly is a privilege. All of our equipment and uniforms have been donated over the years by generous supporters. Our football co-op with the Twin City Sharks is not free. Last year there was a \$3,000 expense covered by participating families and a generous supporter who made up the difference. Our coaches all volunteer and we get everything we can out of our current equipment. Admission Fees: I (Ben) had always found sport admission fees to be at best annoying. 'Why am I being charged to watch my kid play?' Now that I have sat on the administrative side of things I recognize that every game has paid officials, the cost for which has increased by about 50% over the past couple of years. Our culture has abused officials, and there are not many people interested in being yelled at. The purpose for the admission fee is to cover the expense of officiating. So, when you come to our games and pay to get in, we encourage you to look at it as sharing the burden to make athletics available to our students.





We have a fantastic opportunity for those wanting to take their basketball play to the next level. We have a one day basketball camp with PGC (Point Guard College) for boys and girls in grades 5 - 11 planned that will take place at GCS on Saturday, November 2nd.
