COVER LETTER TO "STATE OF THE SCHOOL"

Have you ever wanted to hear "The whole truth and nothing but the truth"? Well, that's what I've prepared for you today. Often times we do not get uncut honesty from people because those with the truth are thinking "You can't handle the truth!" Most of the communication you receive about what is going on in the school is highly edited and lightened to make it palatable because want you to still like us when you're done reading.

I liken this to what we saw in the Presidential Election this year. Kamala Harris would do an interview with network TV. They would have an hour and a half of interview footage and they would edit and splice it into 10-15 minutes for production. This is short form media. When you get the complex evening news topics like the war in Ukraine or the border they've been condensed down into sound bites. During this election cycle a very different form of media that has been growing demonstrated to be more powerful in influence than network media. This is the long form podcast. Donald Trump and his Vice President J.D. Vance went on the Joe Rogan Podcast separately. They each interviewed for 3 hours in an unedited format. It is harder to hide who you are or what you think during a 3-hour discussion.

What has been prepared for you is not an article in the Communiqué. There is a separate attachment titled *State of the School*. As we consider the coming school year (25-26) we need to make some decisions about our future. I do not believe we can continue operating as we have. A lot of time and energy is spent in discussion about where the next dollar is coming from. I would love to redirect that energy in communication/marketing and networking and efficiencies and how we can expand our offerings and experiences.

The attached letter is 8 pages single spaced with widened margins. I understand that most will not read all of it. There is a table of contents to help you find areas of the school you want to know more about. I've highlighted in yellow the sections of the letter that are most pertinent to decision making and encourage you to read those. I intend to have a series of videos that would explain different sections of the letter. Math in paragraph form is difficult.

The goal of this communication is to invite our supporters and those who care about the school to see behind the curtains; to give you the things you need to know if you're going to make a good decision. Also, I am happy to talk with you and answer questions. I'm actually hoping to learn from the vast array of experience that exists in our Association. I do not have the answer. I am sharing what the problems are. In short: Education is expensive and we are not able to charge enough and fundraise enough to cover the expenses. If we think Christian education is important to have in our community, then we who believe that need to come up with a way to cover the remaining expenses.

Thank-you for taking the time to read. We do have a God who is able to do far more than we can think or ask (Ephesians 3:20). Please do not insult the Almighty with a little prayer for our school.

Thanksgiving Page

- A donation of \$30,000 was given to the school for the purchase of 3 new furnaces.
- Efforts made by students, staff and guests working together to set up and tear down for the Christmas concert were a huge blessing!
- GCS received \$1,234 in grant money from the 2024 Nonpublic School Reimbursement Section 152b state grant.
- GCS has been awarded the Filter First grant for \$10, 298 that will help us meet new state water filtering and testing requirements.
- The Chapel sent a work group that painted the elementary hallway.
- Patriots-In-Action raised \$10,871 for our school



- In October, we were able to hire a PE teacher with Watervliet through the Shared Time* program.
- \$4,000 (half of the amount needed) was donated toward replacement gym doors. The \$4,000 given was intended to inspire a matching gift. Would you consider helping us get this significant need met?
- Title money was obtained to enable our teachers to benefit from professional development training last week at the Michigan Association of Christian Schools (MACS) Conference.
- An anonymous donor covered the fee for GCS student athletes to participate in Twin City Sharks football.
- In August, we were able to contract two teachers with Watervliet through the Shared Time* program.
- Heart of Cook Grant \$5,000 for the purchase of a new commercial refrigerator.
- Anonymous donor gave \$2,000 toward student sponsorship.
- Mr. Clean's Cleaning and Restoration cleaned our carpets to prepare for the school year.
- Thank you to those who have brought in school supplies, paper, pencils, facial tissue and cleaning supplies for classrooms.
- School furniture was donated by a St. Joseph business man.
- The thrift store hit their first anniversary on August 12th and in this first year contributed about \$53,000 to the school scholarship fund.
- We received a \$15,000 gift to put toward student scholarships last year. This year we have many other sponsors who have picked families to support. Sponsorship for the 2024-25 school year is complete.
- Roy's Computer Repair and the Nuismer family for their generosity in helping to update our network infrastructure.
- Many hands came together to help get the building and grounds ready for students.
- * Watervliet is covering the salaries of these teachers through an elective program with the State.

MDHHS AWARDS 312 SCHOOLS MI HEARTSAFE DESIGNATION

November 07, 2024



LANSING, Mich. – For more than a decade, the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS), Michigan Department of Education (MDE), American Heart Association, Michigan High School Athletic Association (MHSAA) and Michigan Alliance for Prevention of Sudden Cardiac Death of the Young (MAP-SCDY) have awarded the MI HEARTSafe designation to schools that have taken the appropriate steps to prepare for cardiac emergencies.

Since the program began in 2013, 994 schools have earned this honor. This year, a record-breaking 312 schools are being recognized for their work during the 2023-2024 school year, with 158 schools receiving the award for the first time. These are the most designations in the program's history. A total of 761 schools are actively designated as MI HEARTSafe.

"Being prepared to respond to a cardiac emergency can help decrease incidences of sudden cardiac death among Michigan youth," said Elizabeth Hertel, MDHHS director. "As new laws seek to enhance the ability of Michigan schools to respond to cardiac emergencies, the safety and health of our students continues to be a priority across the state."

House Bills <u>5527</u> and <u>5528</u>, which were passed and signed into law this year, establish comprehensive safety requirements for schools that include cardiac emergency response plans.

To receive a MI HEARTSafe School designation, schools must have:

- A written cardiac emergency response plan and team that can respond to an emergency during school hours and after-school activities and sports
- Current CPR/AED certification of at least 10% of staff and 50% of coaches, including 100% of head coaches and physical education staff.
- Accessible, properly maintained and inspected AEDs with signs identifying locations.
- Annual cardiac emergency response drills.
- Pre-participation sports screening of all student athletes using the current physical and history form endorsed by MHSAA.

"Improving the health, safety, and wellness of all learners is one of the goals in <u>Michigan's Top 10 Strategic Education</u> <u>Plan</u>," said State Superintendent Dr. Michael F. Rice. "We are proud to support Michigan's HEARTSafe schools. Children are safer as a result of a record number of Michigan schools preparing for a cardiac emergency."

Achieving and maintaining the HEARTSafe designation continues to be vital for maintaining a safe environment for Michigan schools. A list of <u>participating schools is available online</u>.

From preschool through high school, our staff actively teach a biblical worldview through daily Bible lessons which are reinforced in every subject area across our curriculum.

That being said, Grace Christian has always struggled with the tensions of paying our teachers an adequate wage and setting affordable tuition levels. Each year we reach out to those who can help alleviate that tension.

As you consider sharing what God has blessed you with, would you consider investing in the lives of our local young people at Grace Christian School?

Here are specific areas of need:

- Fixing the broken tile around the gym floor: \$3,500
- Replacing our second set of exterior gym doors: \$5,000

In the last couple years, God has directed us to local resources, such as shared-time programs and Title II & IV funds. These are perennial benefits that have helped us work toward a balanced budget. Since opening August of 2023, our thrift store, *Reclaimed by Grace*, has contributed \$64,000 to our school through the Thrift Store Scholarship. We know that God continues to walk with us and we see Him work through His people to provide for our needs just as He has these past 50 years.
