"A HOPE AND A FUTURE"

Many Christian homes have art work that reference Jeremiah 29:11 "For I know the plans that I have for you,' declares the LORD, 'plans for welfare and not for calamity to give you a hope and a future." What so many people do not know is the historical background around this promise. Israel is about to receive a divine spanking through Nebuchadnezzar the Babylonian. Jerusalem and the temple are about to be leveled and the people deported to Babylon. Yet God promised a future and hope.

We ordered t-shirts early August for them to be available for back to school night. Administratively, we are optimistic about the future and want to instill optimism to our students and families. Instead of arriving in



August our shirts showed up early December. It was about the same time I sent out the State of the School letter. That is strong mixed messaging. And yet, this is the same pattern we see in Jeremiah 29:11. The present circumstances were not matching the message of hope. It was Jeremiah who wrote Lamentations where we draw this year's theme verse (3:21),

"This I recall to my mind, Therefore I have hope." It continues, "The Lord's lovingkindness indeed never ceases, For His compassions never fail. They are new every morning; Great is your faithfulness." Hope in the midst of difficulty.

I believe this for our school as well. I do believe the future is bright. I believe there is a future and a hope. I do not believe the school is closing, for there are too many good ways to restructure. There will be difficulty and we (administration & school board) are inviting you to share with us your thoughts as we seek the best path moving forward. I have no interest in dragging out uncertainty. I expect to have a plan to share by end of February, whatever that may be.

January 21 and February 4 are GCEA meetings where we (school board/administration) will share for 30 minutes some big picture principles and then it is listening to, answering, and clarifying concerns of our association members and school families. I have had very positive conversations with people who seek the welfare of our school. These conversations influence the direction we are headed. It is important to me and the school board to hear from you either by letter (email), phone call, or association meeting.

In John 15 we see that good branches are pruned to produce more fruit. Looking forward to what God will accomplish in this opportunity,

 possible at one of the special GCEA meetings, taking place on January 21 and February 4 at 6:30 pm.
- Sewer repairs made by volunteers that love GCS.
- \$40,000 year end gift!
- \$5,000 year end gift!
- UPDATE: The furnaces have been purchased and will be picked up this week..
 A donation of \$30,000 was given to the school for the purchase of 3 new furnaces.
- Efforts made by students, staff and guests working together to set up and tear down for the Christmas concert were a huge blessing!
- GCS received \$1,234 in grant money from the 2024 Nonpublic School Reimbursement Section 152b state grant.
- GCS has been awarded the Filter First grant for \$10,298 that will help us meet new state water filtering and testing requirements.
- The Chapel sent a work group that painted the elementary hallway.
- Patriots-In-Action raised \$10,871 for our school
- In October, we were able to hire a PE teacher with Watervliet through the Shared Time* program.
- \$4,000 (half of the amount needed) was donated toward replacement gym doors. The \$4,000 given was intended to inspire a matching gift. Would you consider helping us get this significant need met?
- Title money was obtained to enable our teachers to benefit from professional development training last week at the Michigan Association of Christian Schools (MACS) Conference.
- An anonymous donor covered the fee for GCS student athletes to participate in Twin City Sharks football.
- In August, we were able to contract two teachers with Watervliet through the Shared Time* program.
- ♦ Heart of Cook Grant \$5,000 for the purchase of a new commercial refrigerator.
- Anonymous donor gave \$2,000 toward student sponsorship.
- Mr. Clean's Cleaning and Restoration cleaned our carpets to prepare for the school year.
- Thank you to those who have brought in school supplies, paper, pencils, facial tissue and cleaning supplies for classrooms.
- School furniture was donated by a St. Joseph business man.
- The thrift store hit their first anniversary on August 12th and in this first year contributed about \$53,000 to the school scholarship fund.



- We received a \$15,000 gift to put toward student scholarships last year. This year we have many other sponsors who have picked families to support. Sponsorship for the 2024-25 school year is complete.
- ♦ Roy's Computer Repair and the Nuismer family for their generosity in helping to update our network infrastructure.
- Many hands came together to help get the building and grounds ready for students.
- * Watervliet is covering the salaries of these teachers through an elective program with the State.

QUICKBOOK'S NEW CHARGE

Quickbooks has just announced that starting February 13, 2025, the following change will take effect:

QuickBooks Desktop Payments ACH Bank Transfer rate will be 1% with a cap of \$15. This means that for transactions below \$1,500, you'll be charged a 1% fee. For example, you'll pay a \$2 ACH fee for a \$200 transaction. For transactions over \$1,500, you'll pay a \$15 flat rate fee per transaction.



If you would like to avoid paying these fees, you are welcome to drop off a check or cash in the Main Office, rather than paying on your invoice through Quickbooks.




FEBRUARY MENU
