THE SACRIFICE OF COMMUNITY

Since our last Communique our school has had 2 open meetings for our school community to come together and share the burden of shaping the plan for our school's future. In those two separate meetings a common theme emerged from these different groups of people. That theme is community. That is, we need to develop the connectedness of our school families and by extension those connected church families. This will be accomplished by setting aside time to be with each other and improve communication. Spending time together is more valuable than 20 newsletters.

The surpassing value of the commodity of time: As I work on different committees and boards the most difficult activity is scheduling a time when the group can meet. We are so busy. I often wonder what it is that we are all busy about. I still do not have an answer. As the discussion about building community developed in the GCEA meetings it was recognized that we will not be able to have community building events that accommodate everyone's schedule. The board and Administration will have to plan events that build school community and people are going to be left with choices. Is being part of the school community important to my family? Then we vote with our feet. Choosing to be part of the school community will take sacrifice. For some it maybe sacrificing a night home with a TV show and others it would be something more.

One of the growing points of leadership is recognizing that you cannot make choices for people, but you provide what the choices are and you do not get to choose what you have to work with, but you work with what you have. As we were considering our choices about the future of the school we recognized that there is/would be a committed remnant to keep the school open no matter what. That was certainly an encouragement as we discussed what the future looks like because we have something (committed parents & supporters) to work with.

In light of this support the School Board approved a plan for the 25-26 school year this Tuesday. We will continue to provide excellent Christian education for preschool through High School graduation. The big picture changes include a leaner administration, increased volunteer support during the school day, and a restructuring of the Middle & High School that will provide more pathways for our students. I look forward to sharing the details in the coming weeks.

Again, one of the biggest takeaways from the recent GCEA meetings is the need for community. The School Board meets February 24th at 6:30 where I expect them to set up quarterly GCEA meetings where our school can come together to discuss the events, needs, and progress the school is making. These quarterly meetings are only the spring board for us coming together and care for our school. It will require a sacrifice of time, but sitting on the couch is a sacrifice of time too. Jesus said, "Where the heart is, there will be your treasure also." For those who treasure Grace be encouraged: "Do not fear, for those who are with us are more than those who are with them." II Kings 6:16 (read the context)

- GCS received \$1,234 in grant money from the 2024 Nonpublic School Reimbursement Section 152b state grant.
- GCS has been awarded the Filter First grant for \$10,298 that will help us meet new state water filtering and testing requirements.
- The Chapel sent a work group that painted the elementary hallway.
- Patriots-In-Action raised \$10,871 for our school
- In October, we were able to hire a PE teacher with Watervliet through the Shared Time* program.
- \$4,000 (half of the amount needed) was donated toward replacement gym doors. The \$4,000 given was intended to inspire a matching gift. Would you consider helping us get this significant need met?
- Title money was obtained to enable our teachers to benefit from professional development training last week at the Michigan Association of Christian Schools (MACS) Conference.
- An anonymous donor covered the fee for GCS student athletes to participate in Twin City Sharks football.
- In August, we were able to contract two teachers with Watervliet through the Shared Time* program.
- Heart of Cook Grant \$5,000 for the purchase of a new commercial refrigerator.
- Anonymous donor gave \$2,000 toward student sponsorship.
- Mr. Clean's Cleaning and Restoration cleaned our carpets to prepare for the school year.

- ◆ Thank you to those who have brought in school supplies, paper, pencils, facial tissue and cleaning supplies for classrooms.
- School furniture was donated by a St. Joseph business man.
- The thrift store hit their first anniversary on August 12th and in this first year contributed about \$53,000 to the school scholarship fund.
- We received a \$15,000 gift to put toward student scholarships last year. This year we have many other sponsors who have picked families to support. Sponsorship for the 2024-25 school year is complete.
- ♦ Roy's Computer Repair and the Nuismer family for their generosity in helping to update our network infrastructure
- Many hands came together to help get the building and grounds ready for students.
- * Watervliet is covering the salaries of these teachers through an elective program with the State.


