SPEAKING OPENLY

I like to think that I do not tell people what they should think or what they should do. I rather present evidence and let the case speak for itself. I am beginning to think that is working against me as I try to lead the school to a firm financial footing. I see those actively serving the school (school board, volunteers, and staff) as being in a role similar to the Apostle Paul as he describes in his 1st letter to the Corinthians, 4:9-10:

*“We have become a **spectacle** to the world, both to angels and men. We are fools for Christ’s sake, but you are prudent in Christ, we are weak, but you are strong; you are distinguished, but we are without honor.”*

Too many times I have heard about people who are connected to Grace ask someone actively involved in the school if it is going to close. I am frustrated to the point of anger when I hear about ‘those who are rich in this present age’ (I Timothy 6:17) withholding financial support to our school because they do not want to throw money into a sinking ship. If we were able to receive half of the support of those withholding it we would not be a sinking ship. They are living out a self-determined prophecy at the expense of the next generation.

I do not know all the reasons why the Evangelical Christian Community is determined to maim itself. In my short time at the school I have seen serious supporters and multi-generational families turn their back on Grace over petty Romans 14 squabbles. Where is the Love that covers a multitude of sins? (I Peter 4:8) Where is the pursuit of the things that make for peace? (Romans 14:19) Do we not have enough enemies in the world around us? How many other Christian schools do we have in our area? Do you know the Lutherans and Catholics are licking their chops at the prospect that Grace Christian would go under? Why is that? Because there is no other Christian School to choose; your next best option is them. The local Evangelical Community is pretty much apathetic to whether or not there is a Grace Christian School. A mere 2% of our annual support comes from local churches. The majority of the individuals who support us on a monthly basis are 70+ and live on a limited income.

The miracle within the context of this “sinking ship” is that our students are getting a superior education compared to their public-school peers. It’s not even close. There are families here who financially have no business having a private education, yet God provides. We have excellent teachers who work at 50% of what they could earn in the public system. Our high school of 20 students fields athletic teams that beat public schools that pull from 150. Our music program gets the attention of the director of Cornerstone University. Besides all of this, our students are ministered to daily to know the surpassing value of knowing Jesus Christ. There is no one who does that better in the Berrien/Cass/Van Buren County. Often times it feels like we make thousand-dollar repairs with creativity and a Burger King value meal. And we (Christian Community) would rather watch the ship sink and critique the ones trying to save the ship than get involved. That is very American. Please pull out your camera and start recording.

Do we need money? Of course, we are selling Christian Education to people who are not in the time of life where that kind of money is disposable. Grace Christian has operated under these difficult circumstances for 50 years; not much has changed, but you are hearing clearer communication about them. There is a concerted effort to be less financially desperate. Let’s grow past this! I know I have brought attention to that which exacerbates the sinking ship feeling, but that is the beginning of correction. I am fairly certain there are 20 people who consider themselves friends of Grace

who are rich by the world's standards. The challenge for these 20 individuals is to help right the ship by each committing to a \$10,000 pledge, to be fulfilled once 19 others have joined them. That way no one is left hung out to dry and those investing in the next generation can be confident that Grace will be here tomorrow. This will allow our balanced budget to do its job. I and another will begin the pledges of \$10,000. Please help us find 18 more.

For many others, giving a \$10,000 gift is only a dream. Our Ambassador program is looking for \$50 monthly donations. Our development committee would be happy to set you up with this by calling the office or emailing cleach@gcspatriots.com.

- ◆ In August, we were able to contract two teachers with Watervliet through the Shared Time* program.
- ◆ Heart of Cook Grant \$5,000 for the purchase of a new commercial refrigerator.
- ◆ Anonymous donor gave \$2,000 toward student sponsorship.

As you have read from above we have beloved staff making big changes in their lives that affect their employment with us. We are thankful for each one, whether it has been one year or many. Grace Christian will continue to trust our God to provide, and I am happy to report how some of our positions have been filled and we wait with peaceful expectation for the others to be filled.

6th Grade: With the secondary restructuring, we needed a 6th grade teacher. Mr. Stanbro, our current Science teacher, will make that transition to the upper elementary school. Mr. Stanbro has been another strong Bible oriented male role model. We are thankful that he will continue to serve here.

High School Bible: I am thankful for the opportunity for Mr. & Mrs. Schwarze to be closer to their family. I am especially glad for his children in that they will be near their grandparents. I am also thankful that we have an excellent teacher stepping into the Bible teacher role. We are familiar with Mr. Wellin’s pursuit of teaching excellence, but most are not aware that he has taught Bible previously. We are again thankful.

Shared Time Programing: Our shared time program with Watervliet allowed us to have 3 or our staff paid for with public school money. It has been a huge blessing. Watervliet is not going to continue that partnership with us. Which sounds like bad news, but it actually is great news. With Watervliet’s release we are able to partner with another school district. I’m in communication with Brighton Public Schools to establish this relationship. Brighton is a much bigger district and as a result we will have many more choices to offer in the future, but for next year we are looking for:

- o **Physical Education:** We have a strong lead for this position, but nothing is official.
- o **Music:** With the announcement just today. We are beginning our search for a Christian State-qualified teacher.

“God is God and I am not” is what I tell myself when I feel the pressure of things that are outside of my very limited control. The scriptures say “Be still and know that I am God” (Psalm 46:10). When we pay attention we see how He demonstrates His love and care for us.

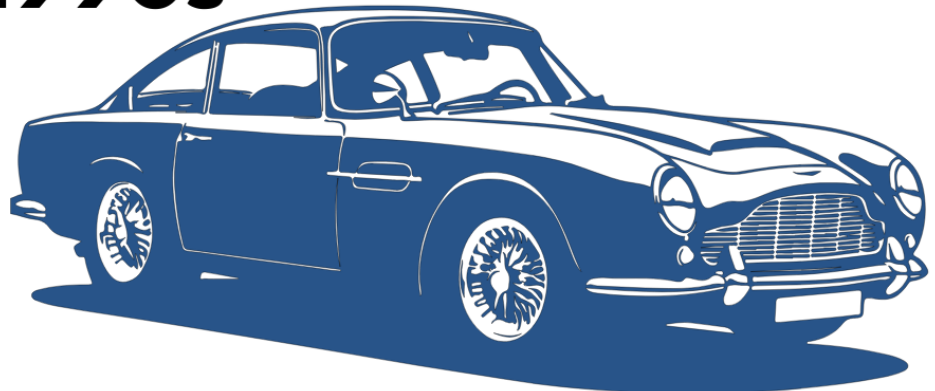
