# FUNDRAISERS: WHAT FOR AND WHY?

Every year there is a healthy discussion at the school board level about fundraising. Universally, the desire is to make fundraisers a thing of the past or simply for small class projects. However, if you pay tuition at Grace Christian School, you likely choose the subsidized rate. There has been much contemplation to make our tuition rate based on what it cost to run the school divided by the number of kids. That maths out to be a little more than \$10,000 per student. We charge between \$2,500 - 4,000 less per student than our average actual cost. We have over a hundred students and the multiplication says we need to raise more than \$300,000 through means other than tuition. There's no way around the fact that life and Christian education are expensive.

**Patriots-In-Action** is our first significant fundraiser of the year. It combines our students serving the community with family and friends sponsoring their efforts to help the school subsidize tuition across the board. Our elementary students visit nursing homes and clean local parks and churches while our secondary students break into groups to help different homes or organizations in the community. I look forward to the day when it is simply a service day. Patriots-In-Action is an outgrowth of our old Walk-athons in the 80s and 90s when we were raising money to build the gym. It's a huge improvement from walking in circles to getting out into the community to serve.

In November, we have two simple fundraisers that take advantage of our desire to eat good things. Our **Apple Pie Fundraiser** is built on a quality product that is easy to enjoy and justify purchasing. At \$15 a pie, we work hard to keep expenses low so that \$10 will benefit the school directly. The **Shemmy's Fish Fry** on **November 1st** will bring a 100% profit for the school: a truly generous gift from those who value the school and the work we are doing here. Please come and invite as many people as you can to make this evening a true success.

As we close out the calendar year we will remind people and businesses to consider Grace Christian School in their **Year End Giving**. The federal legislation passed this year called the One Big Beautiful Bill Act, included new tax credits that begin in 2027 that will benefit private education. Since it is federal in nature, it is something that Michigan schools can receive. **A tax credit of \$1700** per person can be donated to a Scholarship Granting Organization to help students at Christian/private schools. See an article later in this IMPACT for details.

Finally, the most important part of our school financing comes by humbling ourselves before our heavenly Father. We do not put our trust in schemes and our plans are deficient. We are not idle, but we will first do what God has called His people to do: Isaiah 30:15

For thus said the Lord God, the Holy One of Israel,

"In returning and rest you shall be saved; in quietness and in trust shall be your strength."







# PRAYER AND PRAISE

# **GRAHAM**

"Graham was diagnosed with a VSD, Congenital Heart Defect, when I was pregnant. However; upon birth he became ill and was diagnosed with an IAA, another Congenital Heart Defect, but your life line. His was closing, bringing him to near death. We got sent to U of M on 12/24 and Graham had his 1st open heart surgery at 8 days old. This entailed a hybrid procedure, where he had open heart but then had a catheter portion as well so they could place a stent and pulmonary artery bands on to help his heart function to go home and be a normal baby. We have to weigh, check oxygen daily, and he has multiple meds he gets. On 8/19 he actually had a cardiac catheterization done and they replaced his stent and at that time they told us it is time to fully repair Graham's heart. So on 10/17, he will undergo open heart surgery that'll be 8 hours long to fully repair his heart to be normal like ours. There are many risks we are asking



people to pray for: Graham's survival, pain management after the surgery, that his VSD is repaired without any leaks or interruption in the electrical system of the heart that could cause him to have a pacemaker for life, and meaning another open heart, and that his left vocal cord does not get injured causing further procedures needed if so. We also pray for Finley during this time as she will be away from her home and family and friends at school! We pray for the hands of Dr. Lancaster, who will be doing the operation. I have attached a picture also because he is just too cute not to share! And if you look at him you would have no idea he has multiple heart defects! He is our heart warrior!" - Lexi Kuntzman (GCS parent)

# \$1700 TAX CREDIT STARTING 2027

This is not hopeful legislation; it has already been passed. There are a lot of details to work out, but there are some very encouraging big picture truths that we can begin building a ground game for. This is something that can make fundraising optional. We (more than a few people) need to be excited and do the work to make this a realization for Grace. Here are some basic truths as I understand them:

- First, this requires our Governor to opt in to this federal program. Governor Whitmer will be termed out and this needs to be a campaign issue, so that whether red or blue we need to pressure the incoming Governor to promise to help in the education of all students. Scholarships can be issued for public school needs as well.
- This is a tax credit, not a deduction. What this means is that every dollar you give to the Scholarship Granting Organization (SGO) will come back to you against your tax liability as a full dollar. It is \$1700 per tax paying person and \$3400 as a married couple. The logic is that you are going to pay the federal government that money anyway, so why not give it to the SGO for them to issue a scholarship to Grace students? This is federal and crosses state lines.
- The Scholarship Granting Organization is a 501(c)(3) set up to distribute scholarships to students who apply. I will be working with Heritage Christian, Howardsville Christian, and River of Life schools to set up our own Scholarship Granting Organization so that we are not dependent on an out-of-touch 3rd party. SGOs have to distribute 90% to student scholarships, serve at least 10 students and at least 2 schools. Our SGO will do better than giving back 90%.
- This program is scheduled to start January 1, 2027, which means individuals may begin to give to SGOs at the beginning of the 2027 year. SGOs will be able to disburse scholarships for the 2027-2028 school year. Individuals will receive their tax credit in the spring of 2028 when they file for the 2027 tax return. This will be made available year after year.
- To qualify for the scholarship from the SGO, the financials of the family applying must be under 300% of the median income. The federal median income for 2024 was \$83,730. If that number is accurate, families that make under \$251,190 would qualify. Generally, this number increases every year.
- There are no limits to scholarship dollars. Grace Christian could raise tuition to \$20,000 and the SGO could award \$18,000 scholarships per student regardless of how many students per family.

There are 155,000 people in Berrien County. How many of them would like to see their tax dollars directly help local education? We need to being to share this information with people who pay taxes to prepare them to give (money they are already paying to federal government) starting in 2027. Are there not 5,000 people in our Christian sphere of influence who could help make this real for our school?


